General guidelines for the application of the awards & fellowships:

1. The application must be forwarded by the competent authority.
2. Documentary proof for each and every attribute viz. courses taught, thesis awarded to M.Sc./Ph.D. students, 1st page of the publications and attested copies of certificates must be enclosed.
3. **If a candidate has been already awarded one senior award (i.e. J.J. Chinoy Gold Medal or J.C. Bose Gold Medal) or junior award (R.D. Asana Gold Medal or R.H. Dastur Award), he/she is not eligible to apply for the award in the same category again. It means that one candidate is eligible only for one senior and junior award of the society.**
4. **One candidate can submit only one application i.e. either for award or for the fellowship**
5. The application format must be followed, as mentioned below.
6. A candidate can apply either in the “Research” or “Research + Teaching” category and advised to self assess his/her score and mention in the format.
